Tikkun Olam Collections Committee



The next collection, already in the works, will be for backpacks and school supplies for South Lake Elementary School and Identity, Inc. ROSH HASHANAH BASKETS DELIVERY

This is an annual project to deliver "baskets" of Rosh Hashanah necessities to the neediest in our Jewish Community. The baskets are reusable grocery bags filled with everything one would need for Rosh Hashanah -- a freshly baked challah, honey, apples, wine, yahrzeit candles, candy and more. This activity is an amazing mitzvah for you and your family.

We will pick up and deliver 70 Rosh Hashanah baskets on the Sunday before Rosh Hashanah (September 18, 2022). Each person/family is assigned 3-5 baskets for delivery in the same location/building for easy access. Pick up the baskets at the TBA entrance between 9 a.m. and 10 a.m. on September 18. The baskets can be delivered any time up to 2:00 p.m. that day.

Volunteers are encouraged to take safety precautions by wearing a mask, washing their hands often and not going inside the apartments of the residents.

INTERFAITH WORKS WOMEN'S CENTERS (IWWC)

The IWWC, located in Rockville and Derwood, are emergency shelters for adult women, with each center serving up to 35 women. IWWC provides three meals a day, case management, vocational services, and other basic needs to address homelessness and provide stability through generous support of volunteers and donors. Temple Beth Ami will be providing breakfasts and dinners for the Women's Center located in Derwood on Crabbs Branch Way from July 31 - August 4. Volunteers are needed to help prepare and drop off food for the women staying at IWWC during this week.

Watch for an online sign-up link, available shortly, to volunteer to purchase, prepare and drop off food items at the Interfaith Works Women's Center (enough to feed 10 guests). Food should be dropped off at the front desk of IWWC before 6 p.m. each day that week.

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING?

AFGHAN ALLY REFUGEES UPDATE

Temple Beth Ami continues to provide volunteer job assistance support to Afghan ally refugees who were evacuated by the US government last summer. This volunteer assistance includes resume reviews, practice interviews, online search assistance and networking.

To date, volunteer job assistance has been provided to over 50 Afghan Refugees (more than 200 family members) in the area. Several dozen refugees have obtained jobs, mostly in the areas of their education and prior work experience. These include positions in organizations such as National Children's Hospital, Amazon, Save the Children non-profit, Solutions in Hometown Connections non-profit, the US State Department and USAID.
