REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT RECAP

The Temple Beth Ami Refugee Resettlement Group continues our partnership with the <u>New Neighbors Interfaith Alliance</u> (NNIA) and our work with Afghan refugee families. TBA has been granted an award of \$1,000 to support its work in resettling our Afghan neighbors. This grant has been funded by the Jewish Federation of Greater Washington and the Shapiro Foundation.

NNIA is now supporting 10 Afghan refugee families living in various apartments in Rockville, Silver Spring, and Gaithersburg, and is helping family members with ESL tutoring, obtaining health care, food deliveries, and job searches. The Bender Jewish Community Center (JCC) sponsored a wonderful party for the Afghan families at the JCC. The families enjoyed a pizza lunch, ice cream, and a refreshing swim on a day that was in the upper 90s!
